INSTALLATION

1. Lift vehicle and securely place heavy duty jack stands under the manufacturer recommended lifting locations for the front of the vehicle. Take care when lifting the vehicle, and allow 3-4" of ground clearance from the tire. Remove front tires. NEVER WORK UNDER AN UNSUPPORTED VEHICLE. Remove the wheels.

2. Disconnect sway bar from both lower control arms using a 6mm and 21mm wrench. Rotate sway bar and links up away from the lower arm. [FIGURE 1]

3. Remove the sway bar skid plate to gain access to the sway bar brackets (4 x 15mm bolts). [FIGURE 2]

4. Remove one side of the sway bar from the frame to gain access to the lower control arm bolts (18mm). [FIGURE 3]



5. Support the lower control arm and remove the bolts from the frame. Remove the 15mm nuts from the top of the coilover. [FIGURE 4]

6. Remove the 18mm nuts from the bottom of the coilover. [FIGURE 5]

7 Remove the lower control arm pivot bolts using a 24 and 21mm. Lower the arm down so the coilover can be removed. Mark the coil if the tag has been removed. The tag/mark should be facing the frame. You may need to pry on the arm/coilover to get the lower studs out of the arm [FIGURE 6]

8. With the stock coilover removed, use a spring compressor and 18mm socket to remove the spring. If the threads on the top of the shaft are rusted, apply a little WD-40 or similar lubricant to help with the nut removal. Make note of the orientation of the upper mount and the locating pin. [FIGURE 7]



9. Set the factory coilover aside. Grab the new Icon EXP coilover and install the spring perch snap ring, spring perch and spring isolator. Refer to the tech notes for the groove options for your particular Bronco and trim level. [FIGURE 8-11]

10. Slide the supplied foam bumpstop over the shaft with the tapered end facing the shock body. [FIGURE 12]

11. Install the factory coil spring onto the body in the same direction as factory. The tag/mark on the coil should be facing the frame when installed on the truck. Make sure the spring is sitting correctly on the spring isolator. The front of the Icon EXP can be determined by the lower barpin, the short end faces the front, the longer end faces the rear. **[FIGURE 13]**



12. Take the factory upper mount and drill out the center hole to 1/2". [FIGURE 14]

13. With the spring on the shock, compress it down until the threads of the shaft are visible and the upper mount can be installed.

14. Install the upper mount onto the shaft and make sure the orientation is correct and the same as factory. Also be sure the isolator is positioned correctly with the spring. [FIGURE 16]



15. Install and tighten the 1/2-20 flanged nylock nut to 40 ft-lbs. An 8mm wrench can be used to keep the shaft from spinning.

16. Remove the spring compressor.

17. Install the Icon EXP, positioning the upper mount first and lining up the 3 studs and one locating pin, loosely install the 3 nuts. Then position the lower bar-pin into place, making sure the longer part of the bar-pin is facing the rear of the vehicle. Install the 7/16" hardware as shown. [Torque to 50 ft-lbs]. [FIGURE 17, 18, 18a]

18. Reconnect the lower control pivots into the frame. Snug the bolts up, they will need to be tightened once the vehicle is back on its own weight.

19. With the lower arm back in place, remove the nuts on the upper mount, and install the beauty plate as shown. Tighten the 15mm nuts to factory spec. [FIGURE 19]

20. If the tie rod was removed, reconnect it now with a 21mm.

21. If the upper control arm was removed, reconnect it with a 18mm. If an Icon UCA was purchased, refer to those instructions now for proper install.

22. Reconnect the swaybar in reverse order of removal. [FIGURE 20]

23. Repeat process on passenger side.

24. Get vehicle professionally aligned.

VERIFY ALL FASTENERS ARE PROPERLY TORQUED BEFORE DRIVING VEHICLE. RETORQUE ALL NUTS, BOLTS AND LUGS AFTER 100 MILES AND PERIODICALLY THEREAFTER.

2.5 VS SERIES SHOCK & COILOVER TECHNICAL INFORMATION

MAINTENANCE

ICON shock absorbers are a high quality rebuildable race style shock absorber designed for optimal performance. With a unit of this caliber on your vehicle, routine maintenance is required to keep them looking and operating in like new condition. Residual oil and assembly lube may be present at all seal paths from the factory out of the box and is considered normal. Pooling of oil however is not acceptable at any time and one should contact the ICON dealer where purchased.

BELOW ARE GUIDELINES BASED ON HOW YOU USE YOUR VEHICLE BUT YOUR MILEAGE MAY VARY:

STREET USE:

- Send in for factory servicing every 40,000 miles or if a leak develops, ride quality decreases, or they begin to make excessive noise.
- Remove any buildup of road salt, mud, or debris from shocks and coil springs anytime accrued
- Clean with mild soap and water with each oil change or anytime you notice build up.
 Wax the cylinders yearly with automotive wax to prevent corrosion.
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 Check nitrogen pressure yearly. (252004 charge needle assembly available at any ICON distributor)
- Check bearings for excessive wear yearly.
- DO NOT apply any type of lube to the upper and lower bearings.

STREET/DIRT:

- Send in for factory servicing every 15,000 miles or if a leak develops, ride quality decreases, or they begin to make excessive noise.
- Clean with mild soap and water with each oil change, offroad trip, or anytime you notice build up.
- Wax the cylinders yearly with automotive wax to prevent corrosion.
- Check nitrogen pressure each dirt outing. (252004 charge needle assembly available at any ICON distributor)
- Check bearings for excessive wear yearly.
- DO NOT apply any type of lube to the upper and lower bearings.

DIRT USE:

- Send in for factory servicing every 1,000 miles.
- Check nitrogen pressure each outing. (252004 charge needle assembly available at any ICON distributor)
- Remove any buildup of mud or debris from shocks and coil springs after every outing.

This includes labor, parts, and shipping.

ICON Vehicle Dynamics warrants to the original retail purchaser who owns the vehicle on which the product was originally installed. ICON Vehicle Dynamics does not warrant the product for finish, alterations, modifications and/or installation contrary to ICON Vehicle Dynamics instructions. ICON Vehicle Dynamics products are not designed, nor are they intended to be installed on vehicles used in race applications, for racing purposes or for similar activities. (A "race" is defined as any contest between two or more vehicles, or a contest of one or more vehicles against the clock, whether or not such contest is for a prize).
